# 1. 6m Repeater

6m / 70cm and 2m antenna on same feed is being built, time allowing. This consists of 3x separate ¼ wave vertical antennae on the same mounting base. This will soon be tested for repeater use.

# 2. HF Propagation

Over the past few weeks and even months HF propagation has been from poor to below average. Some DX has been worked on 20m in the afternoons and early evenings. Again reports from Mike ZS6MX - a 20m enthusiast – have been received. With signals from fair to good to very good. The Lower bands have improved. The 80m band is opening at 04H00 UTC (06H00 SAST) most mornings. ZS6RAD – Rad, ZS6TED – Ted, ZS6HB – Helge, ZS6BLL – Barney and ZS6WC – Willie have been enjoying good communications in the mornings with signals 5 – 9 +10 reported. It seems that 160m has gone into hibernation.

# 3. Shortwave Stations heard

Various broadcast stations have been heard on the following frequencies on AM: 6139MHz, 5830MHz, 8580MHz as well as Low Band Medium local broadcast Station:

702 KHz - LM Radio, 1485 KHz – Radio Today with BBC Programming mostly during early morning hours, 17.670 MHz – Radio Rumania, 15.250 MHz – China, 21.570 MHz – Bucharest and 9.650 MHz – RSG SW Service.

### 4. HAMNET

There seem to be a definite lack of interest in our area. What we received after our call on a previous occasion/bulletin was mostly negative. Amateurs in our listening area are active members of Community Watches, Forums and CPF units. The feeling is that this is a better way of serving the community – sad but factually true.
